



SITE RULES

This is the very official bit of the programme where we have to get a bit serious for a minute. These rules are largely about keeping you safe, so please have a quick read and stick to them.

01 Youth leaders/responsible adults – it is your duty (and we're sure it's also your joy) to be responsible for the 12 – 18's that you've brought with you at all times.

02 No alcohol, drugs, or weapons are allowed on site. This includes drug paraphernalia or intoxicating agents (such as 'legal highs') except where medically prescribed. Anyone found in possession of these or under the influence, will be referred to the safeguarding team. We will also report any such incidents to the police as necessary.

03 After arrival, all vehicles must be moved to the designated car parks within 2 hours of arrival to comply with fire and safety regulations. Only emergency vehicles or those with a blue badge are allowed on site.

04 Event wristbands must be worn around your wrist at all times and they are the only way to get access into the venues.

05 Smoking /vaping is not allowed inside any of the buildings, marquees or individual tents and caravans.

06 Girls and guys aren't allowed to share a tent/caravan/accommodation unless married.

07 All outdoor ball games, except those in the Sports programme, must be finished by 11pm – even the ones that feel like the pinnacle of your sporting career.

08 The noise curfew is midnight.

09 Tents and caravans can only be moved to a different village with permission from the Ops team. This is so you can be contacted in the case of an emergency.

10 No speeding. When you arrive and leave the site, please keep to the 10mph limit. We know it's incredibly painful but it's important to keep everyone safe. No driving lessons are allowed either – we can't deal with the danger or the arguments.

11 No flyposting or damaging the site – please respect the property of the showground.

12 The only pets allowed at DTI are registered assistance dogs. If you have a registered assistance dog, please introduce them to us in Info on arrival.

13 Generators cannot be used on site. If you need a power supply, please speak to your campsite host. Electrical hook ups can only be provided where these have been arranged before arrival.

14 We believe everyone should be respectful and kind to each other. If you see someone trying to push their beliefs on you or others, please tell us right away at the Info desk. Dreaming the Impossible can cancel the booking of anyone who does this. If you ever feel uncomfortable because of someone else's views, come talk to us at Info, so we can help.

15 Promotion of organisations or activities that do not form part of the Dreaming the Impossible event programme, including the distribution of literature, is only permitted by authorised exhibitors within The Station.

16 Make sure you're covered! We don't run insurance or cancellation schemes here at DTI, so we strongly suggest arranging your own cover through an insurance broker. While we're committed to a safe event, please look after your belongings and yourself; unless required by law, we won't be liable for any loss, damage, or accidents on site. Let's keep the focus on Jesus and the fun – take care of your gear!

17 Please respect other people's privacy and don't take any photos or videos during ministry times. The use of SLR cameras is only allowed by the DTI team.

18 No candles, fires, fireworks or Chinese lanterns are allowed on site. We're sorry – we know they are pretty.

19 Drones cannot be used on site, except by the official Dreaming the Impossible media team.

20 The car park is on the other side of a very busy road to the showground, so please use the underpass when you cross to avoid any accidents. Access to the underpass is via a ramp, but please don't use your bike or skateboard here.

21 Love and respect are at the heart of everything we do. We have a zero-tolerance policy for any form of aggression or abuse toward our team or fellow delegates. To look after our DTI family, anyone found directing abuse at others will be asked to leave the site. Let's make this an amazing, safe week for everyone!
